2020 Chardonnay Sta. Rita Hills

Vineyards: 17% Donnachadh, 28% Spear, 21% Gnesa, 28% Zotovich, and 6% Bentrock Vineyard

"The 2019 Chardonnay Sta. Rita Hills has aromas of toast, white peaches, lemon peel and stone, while the palate is rounded and fragrant with white flower nuances lingering on the finish."

"The 2019 Chardonnay Zotovich Vineyard is bright, airy and ethereal, all typical of this Sta. Rita Hills site. Crushed rocks, mint and white pepper all race out of the glass. The 2019 wonderfully focuses, with plenty of brightness and saline notes in the background."

"As the more affordable appellation blend, this is a brilliant bottling, loaded with winemaker Matt Brady's fresh energy and creative spirit. Fruity aromas of strawberry, cherry and red apple are lifted by pinches of plucked herb on the nose. The palate flies that red-fruit flag boldly but also picks up bay leaf and terpene-loaded herb flavors."

2018 Pinot Noir Las Hermanas Vineyard Sta. Rita Hills

the 2018 Pinot Noir Las Hermanas Vineyard comes from a site in the Sta. Rita Hills and was 50% destemmed. Its translucent ruby color is followed by a pretty, stemmy, Dujac-like nose of ripe cherries and spring flowers. Nicely textured on the palate, medium-bodied, and beautifully balanced, this elegant, seamless Pinot Noir will benefit from a year in bottle and cruise for 7-8 years in cold cellars. It's beautifully done.

2017 Pinot Noir Las Hermanas Vineyard Sta. Rita Hills

"Loads of peppercorns, wild thyme, tobacco and pine-needle aromas ride across crisp raspberry fruit on the nose of this bottling by winemaker Matt Brady. Those herbal flavors dominate the palate as well, where wild chaparral tones meet with crunchy cranberry fruit."

2015 Pinot Noir Las Hermanas Vineyard Sta. Rita Hills

"The 2015 Pinot Noir Las Hermanas Vineyard offers an earthier, more gamey style, with ample forest floor, lavender, tart cherry, and sous bois aromas and flavors. The Gevrey-Chambertin in the lineup, with a decidedly Burgundian flare, this beauty is layered and elegant on the palate, with plenty of saltiness and minerality. Drink it over the coming decade."

"The pale to medium ruby colored 2015 Pinot Noir Las Hermanas is open on the nose, giving up dried rose petal and orange oil, Earl Grey tea, pink peppercorn, pipe tobacco and dusty earth with crushed strawberries, rhubarb and warm black and red cherries and berries. Light to medium-bodied and very silky, it gives up intense spicy fruits with pleasantly dusty tannins and juicy acidity, finishing long, energetic and spicy."

2018 Pinot Noir Rancho La Vina Vineyard Sta. Rita Hills

"Black raspberry and pomegranate aromas meet with anise, sage and rose petals on the engaging nose of this single vineyard expression. Fruity flavors of strawberry and red plum are punchy on the palate, yet given depth by dense, chalky tannins. Both tense and fun."

Pale ruby-purple, the 2018 Pinot Noir Rancho la Vina Vineyard features dried wildflowers, tea leaves and lemon peel on the nose with tones of iron and earth. The palate is medium-bodied with citrus-laced fruits, with juicy acidity elevating the spicy finish.

2017 Pinot Noir Rancho La Vina Vineyard Sta. Rita Hills

94 points, Jeb Dunnuck

The 2017 Pinot Noir Rancho La Vina Vineyard saw 60% whole clusters and spent 18 months in 30% new French oak. More black raspberry, redcurrant, sappy herb, and gamey, foresty notes emerge from this medium-bodied beauty, which has stunning balance, integrated tannins, and a great finish. It too will evolve gracefully for 10-12 years.

Pale to medium ruby-purple, the 2017 Pinot Noir Rancho la Vina Vineyard opens with delicate scents of cranberry, blueberries and blood orange with perfumed layers of dried lavender and forest floor. Medium-bodied, it's appealing and open-knit, with concentrated, juicy berry fruits in a soft frame, finishing long. This packs a powerful flavor punch in a very pretty frame.

2015 Pinot Noir Rancho La Vina Vineyard Sta. Rita Hills

"The 2015 Pinot Noir Rancho la Vina Vineyard has a pale to medium ruby color with aromas of blueberries, roses, crushed stone, tobacco, saline and tangerine peel with rhubarb, strawberry, warm red and black cherries and blackberries with tinges of woodsmoke and earth. The light to medium-bodied palate is silky, featuring broody spices and fruits and swelling with pleasantly chewy tannins and juicy freshness before finishing with tons of vibrant energy."

2018 Syrah Santa Barbara County

"This appellation blend is a smart way to indulge in winemaker Matt Brady's cool-climate ways. Focused aromas of white and black peppercorns meet with tea leaves, cranberry and a hint of tar on the nose. The palate is zesty and light on its feet, with forest berry, elderflower and botanical floral flavors adding to the intrigue."

2017 Syrah Santa Barbara County (88% Syrah/12% Grenache)

Vineyards: Zotovich, John Sebastiano, Donnachadh, Zaca Mesa, Colson Canyon, Larner

"The 2017 Syrah Santa Barbara County has a medium ruby-purple color and a nose of crushed black and blue berry fruits with touches of mint chocolate, olive and charcuterie. It's medium-bodied with Goldilocks ripeness and savory accents, finely framed and finishing long with bright pops of freshness. It's a lovely, understated style."

2019 Syrah Zotovich Vineyard – Sta. Rita Hills

"Sanguine aromas of rust and crushed rocks meet with uncracked peppercorns, purple and red flowers on the dynamic nose of this bottling. Currant and strawberry flavors pop on the palate, where zippy acidity lifts white-pepper, thyme and purple-flower elements into a unique and delicious combination.

"The 2019 Syrah Zotovich Vineyard was 50% destemmed and brought up in neutral barrels. It is almost opaque ruby/purple in color is followed by a spicy, complex, medium-bodied Syrah with lots of stemmy, nutty, spicey nuances, ultra-fine tannins, some juicy acidity, and a great finish. It's another impeccably made wine from this label that has tons of character and is well worth seeking out."

2018 Syrah Zotovich Vineyard - Sta. Rita Hills

"Intense aromas of rosemary, dark clove, dried ginger, pine oil and incense make for a very heady cool-climate expression on the nose of this bottling. It's bright and herby on the palate, where tea-leaf and Sichuan peppercorn flavors buzz through elderberry fruit."

Made entirely with whole clusters and matured in neutral oak, the 2018 Syrah Zotovich Vineyard has a medium rubypurple color and layered aromas of red and black cherries, cracked pepper, bacon fat, licorice, bitter chocolate and mint leaves. The medium-bodied palate is chalky and fresh, with loads of spicy accents defining the long finish.

2017 Syrah Zotovich Vineyard - Sta. Rita Hills

"There are four Syrahs, all seeing plenty of stems and neutral oak. Starting with the 2017 Syrah Zotovich Vineyard, its deep purple/plum color is followed by a great nose of smoked black fruits, chocolate, toasted nuts, sappy violets, and gamey meats. This peppery, medium to full-bodied, silky, and complex Syrah will keep for 10-12 years."
