

# WINEMAKER NOTES

Elegant and 'old-world' spice-box aromatics with umami, minerality, and the smell of the Santa Barbara mountains when on a hike. The generous and supple mouthfeel on the palate is powered by flavors of plums/pluots, wild strawberries, and dark cherries. 50% whole-cluster fermentation adds texture and weight, providing length and allowing the complex spice-driven aromatics to come into harmony with the rich texture and purity of fruit on the palate. Made with fruit from multiple sites within the Sta. Rita Hills and aged in 20% new French oak.

## 2017 VINTAGE

Winter rain between 2016 and 2017 was a welcome relief from the severe 5-year drought. The 2017 growing season was extremely moderate, the only exception being a preharvest heat spike and some tropical moisture, followed by more moderate weather through harvest's end. The wines retain very bright acidity, with full and ripe flavors.

### STA. RITA HILLS AVA

The Sta. Rita Hills AVA is significantly impacted by its proximity to the ocean (10 miles), consistent morning/evening fog, and steady afternoon winds. These cooling trends are not only perfectly suited to growing Pinot Noir, Chardonnay, Grenache, and Syrah but also serve to prolong the growing season, allowing for heightened varietal flavor intensity. Additionally, the area's cool climate and vineyards' calcareous rock and sand help produce grapes with natural acidity and flavor balance.
